5th-8th Grade Math:

We are halfway through the 3rd Quarter. I encourage you to regularly check TADS to monitor your student's progress. Also, it is where you can find assignments if for some reason your student has missed class. If you would like to discuss your student's progress we can set up a time to meet. Aftermath is being offered on Thursdays, from 2:45-4:00. No need to sign up in advance and there is no additional fee. It is on an as need basis. "Aftermath" is a good place for students to get extra help on their homework, study for tests, and do corrections.

Students are allowed to do corrections for half credit. They must show their work in order to get credit for their corrections. Here are the guidelines for **Test and Quiz Corrections**: **1) Do not** erase incorrect answers. **2) Label** the back of the paper or a separate sheet **Corrections.** **3) Redo** the problems missed, showing work or explaining how to do it correctly. **4) Get** a parent signature. **5) Turn** into the basket. **6) Place** returned tests with corrections in the Test section of your binder.

Here is what we have been up to and what's in store:

7th & 8th Grade Bible: The memory verse due on Friday, 3/1 is 1 Peter 2: 24, "He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By His wounds you have been healed." We will be doing Lessons 43-45 in our "One in Christ" workbooks.

5th Grade Math (Period 3): This week we did Lessons 71-74, corrections for Lessons 68-70. Next week we will do Lessons 75-77. Corrections for Lessons 71-74 will be due on Friday, 2/15. **Test 14 covering Lessons 1-70 will be on Thursday, 2/14.** In order to get credit for corrections students must show work so that I know that they understand the material.

Middle School Math (6th grade, Period 4): This week we did Lessons 71-74, Investigation 2 and corrections for Lessons 68-70. Next week we will do Lessons 75-77. Corrections for Lessons 71-74 will be due on Friday, 2/15. In order to get credit for corrections students must show work so that I know that they understand the material. **Test 14 covering Lessons 1-70 will be on Thursday, 2/14.**

Pre-Algebra (Period 4): This week we did Lessons 7.1-7.3 and started our Cumulative Chapters 1-6 Test. Next week we will finish the Cumulative Test, do Lesson 7.4, and review 7.1-7.4 for a **Quiz on Thursday, 2/14.** Corrections for the Chapter 6 Test will be due on Thursday, 2/7. The Cumulative Chapters 1- 6 Test will be on Friday, 2/8.

Algebra 1P (Period 2) : This week we finished reviewing Chapter 6. Monday we will finish our test. Next week we will do the Cumulative Review Chapters 1-6. The Chapter 6 homework and quiz corrections are due by the end of Aftermath on Thursday, 2/14.

Geometry (Integrated Math 2): This week she worked on Khan Academy and Lessons 8.4. Next week she will do Multi-step Trigonometry problems and then begin work on Surface Area and Volume of Solids, workbook pages 48-63 and the corresponding Khan Academy skills.

Science: This week we reviewed for and started our Chapter 4 Test. Next week we will finish the Chapter 4 Test and do Lesson 5.1 covering the Characteristics of Seed Plants.

Student Council: This month our chapel offerings will be given to the missionaries sponsored by LCMS. Student Council decided that the theme for February, 2/15 is DEAR Day (Drop Everything and Read Day with PJ's). 5th/6th Homeroom: The Bethany School Crab Feed was a lot of fun! Thank you to all the students and parents who helped at the Crab Feed and to the parents who came and supported our school.

Bible: We have finished lessons 1-57 in our “One in Christ” textbook. We are going to be working on Lessons 55-57. (Why do Most of our Worship Services Begin with Confession and Absolution?, What Sins do we Confess and to Whom?, Who Receives Absolution? English A: We are finishing up our research on African American Inventors and writing a biography on the person of their choice. New spelling words will be given out on Monday.. A handout will be given as homework instead of writing a story. A reading log is handed out every Friday, and it is due every Friday. Please remember to read daily.

English B: Every Monday, the students will write new spelling words in their planners. Homework consists of defining 10 of the 20 words, writing 20 sentences, a handout will be given as homework instead of writing a story The class will continue to read “Schooled”on Tuesdays and Thursdays. After they have read each chapter, they have to answer a question about that chapter. The class finish up their biographies on a famous African American. Please continue to sign and turn in the reading logs. Spelling and grammar test on March 1st.

English C :7th Grade- The students are continuing to read to the book “Schooled”on Tuesdays and Thursdays. After each chapter they read, there is a question they have to answer for each chapter. The class will start to read and analyze the text. All homework is due on Friday. Spelling test on Friday, March 1 , 2019. Remember to read daily and turn in your signed reading log on Friday. The students will be finishing up their biographies in class and will present them in front of the class to help improve their public speaking.

8th Grade- The students are continuing to read and answering questions on the book "Schooled". The class will finishing up their research on African American Inventors, or another person who made an impact on our history. All homework (definitions, sentences), a handout will be the homework instead of writing a story. All homework is due on Friday, March 1, 2019. Remember to read daily and turn in your signed reading log on Friday.

ADVANCED ART CLASS

This quarter we are moving into advanced art. Having a sketch book and a regular pencil (not mechanical) is **required** for class. We have moved on from two point perspective and working on three point perspective now. I have also given the students a quiz on the school's SLO's.
