I am excited to inform you that we will be attending Coloma Discovery School this year. Coloma Outdoor Discovery School (CODS) is an outdoor education school that has provided educational programs since 1990. Their campus is located on the banks of the South Fork American River, across from the Marshall Gold Discovery State Historic Park, within the Coloma Resort.

We have signed up for the <u>Three Day California Gold Rush Adventure Program.</u> CODS' goal is to celebrate the culture, music, and folklore of the California Gold Rush while using lessons of the past to awaken students' interest and sense of responsibility for the environment.
