Homeroom: This week we focused on getting a good morning routine going and we started working in our One with Christ books. It has worked out really well so far and next week we will be adding some bible reading for homework in order to have deep dive discussions in class.

English 6: They have started their very first writing assignment, which I will be grading over the weekend to give back some feedback on what we must work on. They did such an amazing job with spelling words and vocabulary. Next week they will be having more spelling words to memorize and study, but I believe they are prepared. We will also start reading 30 min per night. Expect their reading logs to come in with them on Monday.

English 8: This English class has been so eager to work in this class and it makes me so happy. They are the winners of this week's Jolly Rancher wars. This is a point system that has been established in our English class and they compete with the other grades to get points.
