Snack & Lunch

For our part time preschool (TK, MWF, T/Th, or M-F 8am-12pm) we ask that you please send your child to school with a small healthy snack (1 or 2 items) for example, a cheese stick and some fruit, crackers and applesauce, or veggies and dip, in a sealed container or baggie labeled clearly with their name and last initial. We also ask that you provide your child with a water bottle as well to be refilled as needed throughout the class time.

For those students in our full time program we ask that each child also be sent with an afternoon snack in a clearly labeled container or bag with their name and last initial, as well as a lunch. Please keep in mind due to state licensing we can not heat or refrigerate any of your child's food items. We recommend using ice packs, freezing things like yogurt so by lunch time they are defrosted and yet still very cool, and for keeping things hot you can wrap items in foil and stick them in a thermos.

Shoes

As per our handbook for safety we ask that all children wear closed toe tennis shoes to school. We realize in the warmer months we want to wear sandals, however due to the bark on the playground that gets into the little holes on the shoes it is very uncomfortable for the children and hinders their play when they have to keep stopping and dumping them out. Also boots are not safe for the climbing structures as they are more slippery. So we do ask for safety as well as comfort that you please have your child wear tennis shoes to school.
